

PR: 20.12.2021: Erasmus+ Project Entre4all on the home stretch

ENTRE4ALL is an Erasmus+ project with the aim of providing training in entrepreneurship for people with disabilities. The six partner organisations Center Ponovne Uporabe (Slovenia), RIC Novo Mesto (Slovenia), Emphasys Centre (Cyprus), equalizent (Austria), Kentro AMEA Agios Lazaros (Cyprus) and DIMITRA Education & Consultung (Greece) are experts in the fields of education and social entrepreneurship.

As the Entre4all project that started in November 2018 is on the home stretch, it's time to take a look back and see what the project has been able to achieve in order to improve the situation and competences of people with disabilities, who want to become social entrepreneurs.

The partnership developed a mapping tool, which shows social entrepreneurship initiatives by and for people with disabilities. This is a great start for aspiring entrepreneurs to get inspiration and see what other people have already done.

Based on several surveys, the project partners have developed an e-learning platform with training materials that are tailored to the needs of people with disabilities who want to become social entrepreneurs. 23 trainers from all participating countries were trained to be Entre4all mentors during an online transnational Train the Trainer week in summer 2021. Entre4all mentors were then able to deliver the Entre4all training programme locally to overall 48 people with disabilities. These local training activities took place at the newly established Entre4all training centres in Austria, Cyprus, Greece and Slovenia. Trainees acquired skills through the 4 main modules of entrepreneurial, digital, financial and social competences. For the optional modules, the project partners decided to create animated videos showing real stories of people with disabilities who have already or want to fulfil their entrepreneurial dreams. The participants were awarded with Open Badges.

Overall the Entre4all project has been a great success and the project partners and other organisations are happy to continue to work with the project outputs developed in the future.
