VET for NAI is an ambitious Erasmus+ project that targets early and effective integration of newly arrived immigrants (NAIs) in the labor market through integrated training, engaging training concerning the host country language as well as technical skills in their job field. This will increase their accessibility to European labor markets and will foster their inclusion into their host countries' societies.

The project addresses the need to promote swift integration of NAIs into the labor market through strengthened cooperation and mobilization of employers and social and economic partners in each country. Collaborating partners on the project are Sweden, Greece, Netherlands, Italy and France.

By 2024, VET for NAI project aims to create a Guidance Toolkit that will be available and resourceful for any organization and stakeholder working with integration and career guidance, and providing newly arrived immigrants the complementary skills and competences (technical and linguistic), to enable them to better respond to the requirements of labor market needs in a new country.

**The Guidance Toolkit** will be based on empowering newly arrived immigrants, focusing on active choice on their entrance into the labor market. The Toolkit will provide:

**Information** - elaborated and interactive material that will promote NAI's active participation in gathering, analyzing and understanding information about the vocational and employment situation of their host country.

**Assessment** - opportunity to self-assess knowledge, interests, and abilities.

**Career Guidance** - support to develop a realistic career plan to analyze and use, with an emphasis on life skills.

**Labor Market Opportunities** - advice on educational and job opportunities. Advice on how to learn about job market trends, high demand occupations with a high potential of finding employment and developing a career.
