



INTRODUCTION TO THE PROJECT

Project Development of inclusivE iNteGration pAths 4 miGrant women/
ENGAGE aimes to increase TCN women's capability for entering the labour
market and social life of the host society. TCN women, which are representing
the 45% of refugees in the EU, have lower activity and employment rates, a
higher risk of poverty and are more likely to be in lower skilled occupations.
Most of them face particular integration challenges associated with lower
education and labour market outcomes compared to refugee men. A main
reason is that they are coming from countries with high gender inequality and
low employment rates for women. Therefore, an effective integration process
of these women in the new social environment, can contribute to their social
and economic inclusion.

VOLUNTEERING AS AN INTEGRATION PATH

In European countries, volunteering is regarded as an important part of a career path and personal development, especially for young people. Regardless of your age, volunteering for social or humanitarian causes will give you opportunities to make new acquaintances, be recognized as a reliable worker, and will provide a valuable experience for your resume. It can also improve your networking circle and your initiative. If you're just starting out and you can afford it, volunteering can be a great way to gain valuable industry contacts. The relationships you create at volunteering may open other doors to paid jobs.



Most types of volunteer work fall into one of five major categories: environmental, animals, social, healthcare or sports and leisure. Typical examples of volunteering opportunities include:

- Volunteering with youth clubs, schools, or charities that support families
- coaching a youth sports team
- Soup kitchens, food pantries and homeless shelters are always looking for volunteers to help serve food and cook meals.
- Animal shelters are always looking for volunteers to help clean cages, feed animals, walk dogs, play with cats and conduct behavioural training
- You can volunteer at senior citizen events or a nursing home and paint nails, read books, bring baked goods, make birthday cards, and so much more





Depending on your residency country's laws, you might be able to receive a small compensation or benefits such as a discount on entry fees for cultural institutions for your voluntary work.

Especially if you have difficulty finding paid work or are not (yet) allowed to sign an employment contract, volunteering offers a wide range of advantages:

- Showing initiative and motivation to prospective employers
- Getting to know the culture of the arrival society
- meeting new people who might also be able to help you in finding paid employment
- improving your social and language skills
- If you are volunteering at an institution which also has paid employees, you
 are likely to be considered for the next opening if you have the right
 qualifications

INTERCULTURAL FESTIVALS

On occasion of the International Migrants' Day on December 18th, several of the partner organizations hosted intercultural festivals where the interested public was invited to come together, learn more about the project and get to know the participants while listening to live music and enjoying some food and drinks.
