EU GREEN TOUR

The EU GREEN TOUR project officially launched in September 2024 with a clear and ambitious vision: to empower students in vocational education and training (VET) as active agents of sustainability and digital citizenship. This Erasmus+ initiative sets out to achieve two key outcomes: the development of an interdisciplinary green curriculum using CLIL methodology—integrating science, geography, English, and vocational subjects—and the creation of a dynamic online newspaper, the EU Green Tour (EU GT), focused on sustainable development and the tourist enhancement of local territories.

AIMS

The project aims to foster a mindset among students centered on ecological awareness and civic engagement in the digital age. Specifically, EU GREEN TOUR seeks to strengthen the sustainability component of VET curricula, enhance students' digital skills through the development of the EU GT platform, and empower learners to take on an active, managerial role as eco-digital content creators. In doing so, the project offers both educational innovation and territorial promotion through youth-driven storytelling.

1ST TPM - ONLINE



The first online Transnational Project Meeting (TPM), held on November 18th, 2024, brought together project partners from Italy (Ilmiolavoro and USR Abruzzo), Greece (DIMITRA), Sweden (Folkuniversitetet), and the UK (UKRAINE). The meeting was structured around key topics, including monitoring and evaluation, curriculum development, dissemination, and financial planning. Ilmiolavoro introduced the monitoring and evaluation (M&E) plan, outlining tools and procedures for data collection, and confirming that evaluations will occur every four months.

FIRST STEPS

USR Abruzzo presented the findings from the desk research and shared the proposed structure of the Learning Units (LUs). Each partner is responsible for developing one LU on a specific topic: DIMITRA will cover "Weather, climate and climate change", UKRAINE will develop "Reconnecting to nature and protecting it", Folkuniversitetet will address "Tackling climate mis/disinformation", USR will work on "Responsible consumption", and Ilmiolavoro will prepare a unit on "Sustainable living spaces."



With this first newsletter, the EU GREEN TOUR project marks the beginning of a collaborative journey where students become not just learners, but creators and narrators of a greener, more sustainable future. Stay connected as we continue building the tour—unit by unit, article by article, voice by voice.
